

- [EBSCO ebook Collection](#) The EBSCO Ebook Collection (formerly NetLibrary) is a collection of more than 1000 online books in all subject areas. Books range from works of fiction and other literature to scientific and technical books. Materials are appropriate for students and researchers at all levels.
- [EBSCOhost Databases](#) EBSCOhost Databases is a portal to 30+ databases providing indexing and abstracting for tens of thousands of scholarly journals, magazines, and reference sources in all areas of study. Many of these databases include full text articles. The academic level of the publications covered varies depending on the database, but the brief descriptions on the opening page will help you determine whether a particular database is appropriate for you.
- [EBSCOHOST Integrated Search](#) EBSCOhost Integrated Search allows users to simultaneously search EBSCO databases as well as all other electronic resources, including those from other database aggregators, OPACs, and publisher packages. This is sometimes called federated searching. The EBSCOhost search experience integrates the other electronic information resources into one results group.
- [EBSCOhost Mobile](#) EBSCOhost Mobile provides mobile-formatted access to our 30+ Ebsco databases. These offer indexing and abstracting for tens of thousands of scholarly journals, magazines, and reference sources in all areas of study. Many of these databases include full text articles.

3. Check the “Select/deselect all” box which is located under the “Continue” link.

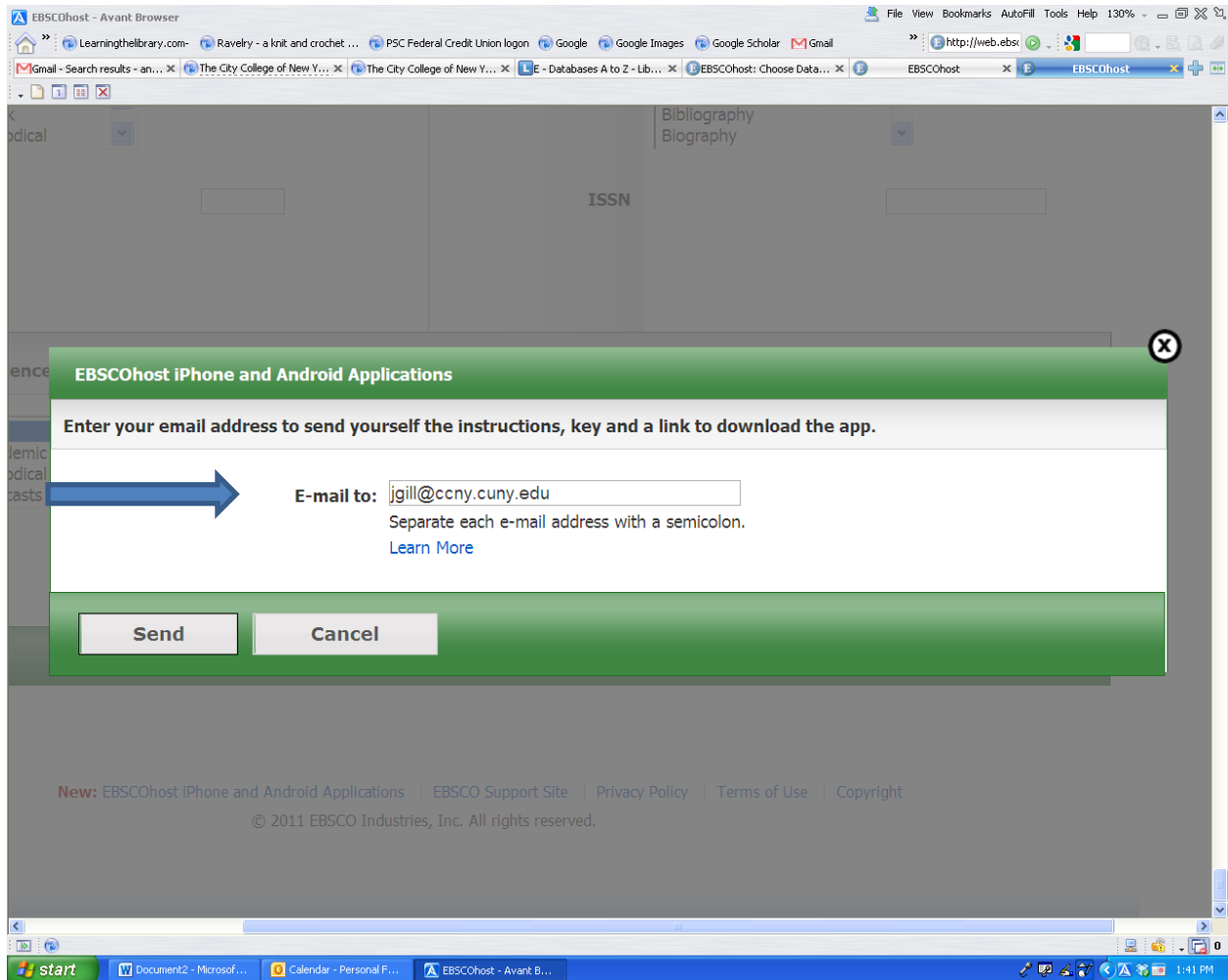
- Academic Search Complete**: Academic Search Complete is the world's most valuable and comprehensive scholarly, multi-disciplinary full-text database, with more than 8,500 full-text periodicals, including more than 7,300 peer-reviewed journals. In addition to full text, this database offers indexing and abstracts for more than 12,500 journals and a total of more than 13,200 publications including monographs, reports, conference proceedings, etc. The database features PDF content going back as far as 1887, with the majority of full text titles in native (searchable) PDF format. - Book Review Digest (H.W. Wilson)**: Book Review Digest, produced by the H.W. Wilson Company, is a reference database that provides review excerpts and book summaries from 1983 to the present for current English-language fiction and non-fiction books for all ages. Abstracting and indexing is included for more than 163,950 books, with more than 8,000 new records from 120 periodicals added per year. [More Information](#)
- Business Source Complete**: Business Source Complete is the world's definitive scholarly business database, providing the leading collection of bibliographic and full text content. As part of the comprehensive coverage offered by this database, indexing and abstracts for the most important scholarly business journals back as far as 1886 are included.
