JG - What assessment methodology did QC use and was the course changed based on the results?

ADL - Very briefly: The tools we use to evaluate the credit courses are:

1. course evaluations
2. questionnaires

We have a formal college faculty evaluation, and an informal course evaluation that my office generates. I was unable to get you a copy of the college wide one. The informal office one I attach herewith. We also give out a questionnaire to the students--its not really assessment, except to see their preparedness for the class.

We could tweak the courses every time based on student comments but we usually don't. Or maybe I should say we haven't had a need to.
